 in Christ's communion bread.

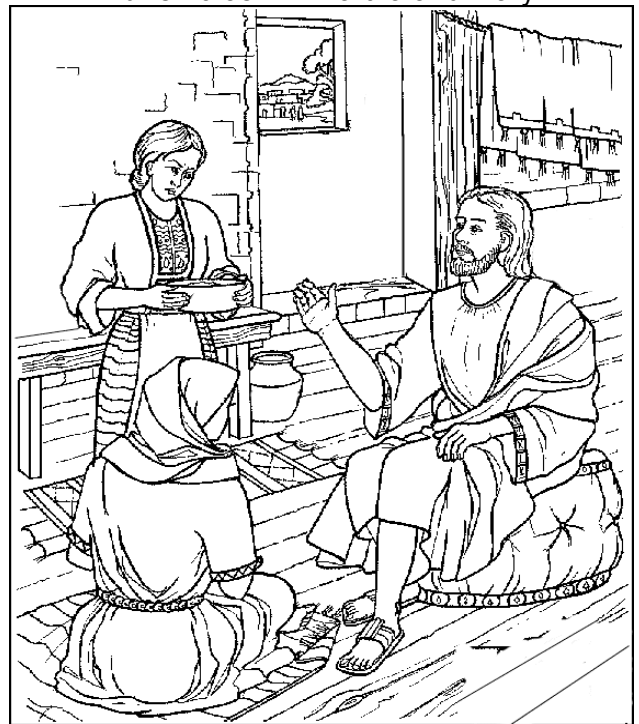
As Christ breaks bread, and bids us share,
